PROGRAMME BACKGROUND

The World Melayu-Polynesia Organisation and Nusantara Technology Sdn. Bhd. in partnership with the Research Centre for Malay Excellence and Academy of Malay Studies University of Malaya is hosting the 3rd International Conference on Malay-Polynesia. With the theme of "Strengthening Youth Entrepreneurship across Malay Polynesia", the conference mainly focused on Malay-Polynesian youths, seeks to chart directions and strategies in understanding a globalised Asia-Pacific Century for the next 20 years (2019-2038). It's a world dominated by China, Japan, Korea and Australia, while the less developed ASEAN, Malaysia, Indonesia and Polynesia, lag behind. Understanding this as crucial, we need to realise early to be more forward planning by identifying strategic areas for intervention. This conference therefore, very focused in showcasing young talents; especially relevant in guiding educational planners, job and career providers, and policymakers that prepares a world blueprint for present and future generations. This conference also has being anticipated by cultural activists, thought leaders, scientists and scholars to bring about ideas, perspectives, paradigms and models in coping with the new youth futures.

The objectives is to build bridges amongst youths in countries of Malay-Polynesia, understand our common civilizational similarities in culture, language and genetic make-up, exchange ideas in cross-cultural education, institutions and social learning through adopting leadership ways, role models as well as corporate players for personal advancements, and learn and engage in entrepreneurial pursuits and motivational examples that can promote and produce community wealth and wellbeing.

The conference has been attended by the scholars from various field which also included curriculum planners, educational counsellors, scientists, teachers and academicians and also cultural activists. Recorded participation are about 120 in total.

The conference focus speakers are also renowned scholars in the various field, such as Professor Emeritus Dato' Dr. Hashim Yaacob (UM), Professor Dr. Zafarina Zainudin (USM), Professor Dr. Masuri Othman (UKM), Professor Dato' Dr. Ahmad Murad Merican (USM), Professor Dato' Dr. Yaacob Harun and Dr. Muhamed Zain Musa, Musa-Asiah Foundation, Cambodia. Apart from these focus sessions, there will be almost 20 paper and poster presentations from local and foreign speakers.

The paper presentations cover a range of Malay-Polynesian contexts. Among them are issues of generational gaps of young and old Malay-Polynesians, history of the Malay-Polynesian Civilization and Archeology, the genetic evidence of migration history in Malaysia, Malay community of Western Australia, the minority in Tenasserim Coast, future technologies, artificial intelligence, fundamentals of entrepreneurship, and halal enterprises.

OPENING CEREMONY

The opening ceremony commenced with a speech by Dato' AR Hajeedar Abd Majid, President ICOMOS and Chairman of Majlis Warisan Negara (JWN). In the beginning of his speech, Dato' AR Hajeedar created a pleasant atmosphere by showing his gratitute to be part of the conference and acknowledge the organisers for such a great job by be able to gathered all the honourable scholars at the conference. Expressing his hope that the conference be successful, he expressed his expectation that this conference be utilized as a place of mutual understanding and information exchange among the participant.
